Course Outline

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Earth Science is a yearlong course typically taken by 8th grade students. Students will observe, experiment, read, and analyze data about the various components of Earth Science. Connections will be made between Earth Science, the other sciences, mathematics and other content areas, using technology, readings, and a variety of investigations, explorations, and activities.
